

Parent/Guardian Information for Elementary Continuous Learning Plan

4 Categories of Continuous Learning

Individual Student - Long Term Virtual Learning

(longer than 1 month, and up to 10 months)

Who is an Individual - Long Term Virtual Learning Student?

- A student whose parents/guardians choose for him/her to learn virtually during the school year when school buildings are open to students
 - Your child may come back to school whenever you choose, or stay home and learn virtually throughout the entire school year.

How will the students receive their educational experience?

- Lessons will be provided by a grade level virtual teacher
- Students must have 5 hours of instruction/assignments/assessments per day to meet Indiana guidelines
- Students will receive reading, language/grammar, writing, math, and science(4th) or social studies(5th).
- Your child will receive his/her lessons/assignments/and teacher feedback through Google Classroom
- Your child will receive a daily schedule to follow.
 - Your child is encouraged to participate in "Live Lessons" with Google Meet, for a high quality learning experience, that enables them to interact with their peers and teacher
 - If your child is unable to participate in the "Live Lessons", the Google Meet Lessons will be recorded to watch at a time that is convenient for your family.
- Students will be issued a Mississinewa device:
 - o Kindergarten 1st grade students will use iPads
 - 2nd grade 5th grade students will use a MacBooks (laptop)
- Students will receive traditional grades
 - o Students will receive 2 grades per subject area each week
 - o Grades will be posted on PowerSchool

How will my child participate in NWEA?

- Your child will take NWEA 3 times per year. (August, December, and May)
- You will have choices on how to take NWEA:
 - Virtual students can take the assessment before or after school in a sanitized room with a small group of students who are placed at least 6 feet away from each other.
 - Virtual students can take the assessment with only a teacher before or after school in a sanitized room.
 - Virtual students can take the assessment at home.
 - It is important that students are in a quiet area and don't receive help on their assessment so we can know exactly where the students are to provide the most accurate educational experience for them.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:

- Contact the school office to announce when your child will be starting and returning from long term virtual learning
 - The grade level virtual teacher will start communication with you.
 - A parent/guardian will need to pick up your child's device from the school office.
- Communicate with virtual teacher through Seesaw
 - Schedules
 - Assignments
 - Attendance
- Monitor your child's grades and attendance in PowerSchool

Individual Student - Short Term Virtual Learning

(approximately 2 weeks to 1 month)

Who is an Individual - Short Term Virtual Learning Student?

• A student who is sick with no/mild symptoms, quarantined due to being exposed to a person with COVID-19, or decides to do short term virtual learning due to concerns about COVID-19.

How will the students receive their educational experience?

- If your child is out 1 to 10 days he/she will receive his/her assignments from the classroom teacher on Google Classroom
- If your child is out more than 10 days the lessons will be provided by a grade level virtual class teacher, but your child stays on his/her classroom teacher's PowerSchool roster for easy transition back to the classroom
 - If a student ends up staying out longer than one month, when the school buildings are open to students, he/she will continue to receive his/her lessons from the grade level virtual teacher and be moved to the virtual teacher's PowerSchool roster.
 - If all students go to short term virtual learning or long-term virtual learning the student will begin to receive his/her lessons from the original classroom teacher.
- Students must have 5 hours of instruction/assignments/assessments per day to meet Indiana guidelines
- Students will receive reading, language/grammar, writing, math, and science(4th) or social studies(5th).
- Your child will receive his/her lessons/assignments/and teacher feedback through Google Classroom
- Your child will receive a daily schedule to follow.
 - Your child is encouraged to participate in "Live Lessons" with Google Meet, for a high quality learning experience, that enables them to interact with their peers and teacher(s)
 - o If your child is unable to participate in the "Live Lessons", the Google Meet Lessons will be recorded to watch at a time that is convenient for your family.
- Students will be issued a Mississinewa device:
 - Kindergarten 1st grade students will use iPads
 - o 2nd grade 5th grade students will use a MacBooks (laptop)
- Students will receive traditional grades
 - Students will receive 2 grades per subject area each week
 - o Grades will be posted on PowerSchool

How will my child participate in NWEA?

- Your child will take NWEA 3 times per year. (August, December, and May)
- You will have choices on how to take NWEA:
 - Short term virtual students can take NWEA when they return to school.
 - Short term virtual students can take the assessment at home.

It is important that students are in a quiet area and don't receive help on their assessment so we can know exactly where the students are to provide the most accurate educational experience for them.

 - The grade level virtual teacher will start communication with you.
 - o A parent/quardian will need to pick up your child's device from the school office.
- Communicate with virtual teacher through Seesaw
 - Schedules
 - Assignments
 - Attendance
- Monitor your child's grades and attendance in PowerSchool

All Students - Long Term Virtual Learning

(approximately longer than 1 month, and up to 10 months)

Why would Mississinewa have Long Term Virtual Learning for all students?

- Outbreak in the community
- State mandated school closure with virtual learning

How will the students receive their educational experience?

- From August 6th August 14th students will be provided with paper packets in an eLearning Folder
- Starting August 17th lessons will be provided by the student's classroom teacher on Google Classroom, because students will take their devices home every night starting August 14th
- Long Term Virtual Students stay with their grade level virtual teacher and lessons are provided by the virtual teacher
 - Long Term Virtual Students will continue to receive their virtual lessons from their grade level virtual teacher when students return to school
- Short Term Virtual Learners will receive lessons from their classroom teacher in the event that school closes
- Students must have 5 hours of instruction/assignments/assessments per day to meet Indiana guidelines
- Students will receive reading, language/grammar, writing, math, science(4th) or social studies(5th), art/music, physical education, technology, science, and library.
- Your child will receive his/her lessons/assignments/and teacher feedback through Google Classroom
- Your child will receive a daily schedule to follow.
 - Your child is encouraged to participate in "Live Lessons" with Google Meet, for a high quality learning experience, that enables them to interact with their peers and teacher
 - o If your child is unable to participate in the "Live Lessons", the Google Meet Lessons will be recorded to watch at a time that is convenient for your family.

- Pick up your child's device at a Device Distribution, if Mr. McKenzie announces a closure in the evening or on a
 weekend, when students haven't had the opportunity to pack up their devices and bring them home from
 school.

All Students - Short Term Virtual Learning

(approximately 2 days to 1 month)

Why would Mississinewa have Short Term Virtual Learning for all students?

- A student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19
- Outbreak in the community
- State mandated school closure with virtual learning

How will the students receive their educational experience?

- From August 6th August 14th students will students will be provided with paper packets in an eLearning Folder
- Starting August 17th lessons will be provided by the student's classroom teacher on Google Classroom, because students will take their devices home every night starting August 14th
- Long Term Virtual Students stay with their grade level virtual teacher and lessons are provided by the virtual teacher
 - Long Term Virtual Students will continue to receive their virtual lessons from their grade level virtual teacher when students return to school
- Short Term Virtual Learners will receive lessons from their classroom teacher in the event that school closes
- Students must have 5 hours of instruction/assignments/assessments per day to meet Indiana guidelines
- Students will receive reading, language/grammar, writing, math, science(4th) or social studies(5th), art/music, physical education, technology, science, and library.
- Your child will receive his/her lessons/assignments/and teacher feedback through Google Classroom
- Your child will receive a daily schedule to follow.
 - Your child is encouraged to participate in "Live Lessons" with Google Meet, for a high quality learning experience, that enables them to interact with their peers and teacher
 - o If your child is unable to participate in the "Live Lessons", the Google Meet Lessons will be recorded to watch at a time that is convenient for your family.

How will my child participate in NWEA?

 - The school might wait until students return to school to take the assessment, depending on how long the short term period is.
 - The school might decide to have the students take the assessment at home.
 - It is important that students are in a quiet area and don't receive help on their assessment so we can know exactly where the students are to provide the most accurate educational experience for them.

 - Schedules
 - Assignments
 - Attendance
- Monitor your child's grades and attendance in PowerSchool
- Pick up your child's device at a Device Distribution, if Mr. McKenzie announces a closure in the evening or on a
 weekend, when students haven't had the opportunity to pack up their devices and bring them home from
 school.
